Registration and payments

Conference only registration includes:

Workshop only registration includes:

Full registration includes:

- Morning, afternoon teas, lunch, welcome function and gala dinner during the conference dates
- Workshop attendance and materials 23 and 24 July 2026.

Cancellations

Any cancellations must be submitted in writing to icmc2026@uq.edu.au. The following cancellation policy applies:

- Cancellations received on or before 15 April 2026: Eligible for a 100% refund.
- Cancellations received between 16 April and 1 June 2026: Eligible for a 50% refund.
- Cancellations received from 2 June 2026: No refund will be issued.
- If the conference is cancelled, 100% of the registration fee will be refunded.
